

At St Martin's, we are proud to announce the phased introduction of the *Nelson Handwriting Scheme*, a carefully developed programme designed to support children in developing fluent, legible and confident handwriting.

In an age where screens and keyboards dominate, we firmly believe in preserving the timeless skill of beautiful penmanship. Handwriting is more than just a means of

communication — it is a reflection of care, discipline, and pride in one's work. Through the Nelson scheme, we aim to nurture these values from the earliest stages of writing.

This new approach will begin with our Infant classes and gradually roll out across the school, with sensitivity to those pupils who have already established a style of joined handwriting. We understand that each child is on a unique handwriting journey, and our introduction of this scheme will reflect that – gentle, tailored, and supportive at every step.

You may recall the excitement of earning your very first *pen licence* — that cherished moment when pencil gave way to pen, marking a milestone of pride and progress. We will continue to honour such traditions, using them to inspire our children to take pride in neat, consistent handwriting as part of their daily learning.

For families curious about the specific letter formations or joins that their child is currently focusing on, examples are available above, and we warmly encourage you to contact your child's class teacher for further details. Open communication between home and school is key to reinforcing these skills and celebrating progress together.

Handwriting remains a core skill — not just for academic success, but for self-expression and lifelong confidence. We look forward to seeing our pupils flourish as they take these important steps, pen in hand.

After an accident preparing for the Royal Tournament in 1999 left him with a leg amputation which led to 25 surgeries, Sean did not let his journey stop there. Battling cancer twice with unwavering grit, he's triumphantly competed in both the Invictus Games and Commonwealth Games. Sean's story is one of incredible resilience, proving that with determination, even the toughest challenges can lead to extraordinary achievements.

Some of Sean's achievements include:

- 💢 2 Gold medals, a Silver and a Bronze at the Invictus Games
- ★ 2 World Championship Gold medals, a Silver and a Bronze
- ★ Held 13 National titles as a Para-powerlifter and indoor rower
- ★ 30 World records in indoor rowing and skiing
 ★ Para-powerlifter in the Commonwealth Games

Year 4 Celebrate Bandi Chhor Divas – A Festival of Freedom and Justice



As part of Mr Fidlin's ongoing drive to enrich our *Religious Education and World Beliefs* curriculum, our Year 4 pupils recently took part in a vibrant and thought-provoking

celebration of *Bandi Chhor Divas* — a Sikh festival that commemorates the release of 52 Hindu princes by *Guru Hargobind Sahib Ji*.

This immersive lesson brought faith, history and values to life in a truly engaging way. Pupils re-enacted key moments from the story, stepping into the shoes of historical figures to better understand the powerful message behind the festival. We also role-played what a visit to the *Gurdwara* (Sikh place of worship) might involve, gaining insight into Sikh traditions of worship, hospitality, and community.

A particular highlight was our own version of the *langar*, the communal meal shared in Gurdwaras, where pupils enjoyed tasting traditional Indian sweets — much to their delight! This sensory experience helped reinforce the themes of equality and service at the heart of Sikh practice.

Inspired by the actions of Guru Hargobind Sahib Ji, pupils took time to reflect deeply on the ideas of *justice* and *freedom* — not just within the story, but in the context of the wider world. These reflections sparked thoughtful conversations about how we, even as children, can stand up for what is right and support those whose voices may not always be heard.

A special thank you to *Mrs Nijjar* and *Hinaya* for their support and contributions, which helped make this learning experience even more meaningful and authentic.

Through lessons like these, we continue to build a curriculum that celebrates diversity, encourages empathy, and inspires moral courage — true hallmarks of the educational values we strive for at our school.




